

- First named team is home team and occupies 3rd base dugout and fields 1st.
- Games shall be 7 innings duration or until a result is achieved.
- Ten run rule will apply after 5 innings.
- Games will not commence earlier than noted in the official draw.
- There will be a minimum of thirty (30) minutes between games.
- After elimination round, teams will be split into two groups top 4 to play in championship round, 3 to play in consulation round. Where points are equal then placings is determined by the result of the games played between the tied teams in the qualifying round.
- Allocation of points: (championship round) The only points and percentages to carry over into the second round are those based on results of games played among teams qualified for the championship round: (consultation round) All points and percentages are cumulative and do carry over into the second round.
- 8. Pre-game warm up: The visiting team is entitled to the diamond for a seven (7) minute warm up, 20 minutes before the scheduled starting time. The home team shall be entitled to seven (7) minute warm-up, twelve (12) minutes before the scheduled starting time.

PARRY Field at Belmont Oval — some details, facts and figures.

Parry Field built and designed by the Belmont City Council which cost around \$1m., is the first international baseball facility in Australia, and while primarily a baseball park, has been specifically programmed to cater for other small or medium sized ground requirement sports.

There is no permanent dirt mound, and in normal fixtures, a two-piece fibreglass mound is used which can be just picked up and taken away making the ground immediately available for alternative events.

The synthetic turf infield is known as Westurf Synthetic Turf.

The complete surfacing system, which has a drainage fall of 1 in 122 from the centre, consists of a sand infilled synthetic turf laid on top of a high density foam.

A very accurately laid base of crushed rock topped with Hotmix bitumen forms the foundation for the surfacing.

The system has been specifically designed to assimilate, as closely as possible, resilience of natural turf and at the same time give a realistic ball bounce and roll, keeping durability and maintenance cost-saving in mind.

Parry Field Committee had laid in the batting cages, various types and grades of synthetic turf with various underlays to test run the surfaces over an extended period before recommending a final surface.

Facts And Figures:

Total area synthetic, 2158m squared. Sand infill: 45 tonnes — 20kg/m squared.

Total cost: approximately \$70,000. Cost of other types of synthetic turfs, like Astroturfs, would have been around \$300,000.

The Parry Field Committee considered that Astroturf-type surfaces give the ball an unrealistic high bounce, and apart from the very large difference in cost, the present surface assumes the closest comparison to high quality grass surfaces for our sport.

The life of the Westurf surface is estimated at around ten years.

However, the big advantage of the material used enables heavily worn areas such as the run up to first base to be cut out and be replaced with the local supplier always available for consultation.

The present surface was manufactured in Melbourne, however, in the next few months, material will be manufactured locally.

Provision is made for trapdoor spider hole bases for international men's and women's softball (60ft diamond) under-15 international junior distance and 17 and senior baseball with concrete base sleeves for the 17 and senior (90ft diamond) embedded in the cutout.

It is proposed to extend the infield to the dugouts when finance becomes available.

The dimensions of the field are: 330ft at both foul lines and tapering to 386ft in centrefield.

To cater for other sports the 2 metre high outfield fence is not a curved structure, but two straight fences from each corner and a straight line centrefield join.

The fence is fixed by sleeves in the ground and provision is made for the fence to be moved back 20ft all round if and when required.

Floodlighting: The masts are the tallest free standing concrete structures in WA. They are 40 metres above the surface of the playing field.

The eight towers are Duraspun, hollowed-tapered, reinforced concrete with inline joints at 21 metres.

Each pole weighs ten tonnes and is designed to resist wind speeds of 144 kl per hour.

Lightning conductors are placed at the tops of each mast.

The footings are a 5.4 by 0.6 metres octagonal reinforced concrete raft with 1.2 metres by 0.75 metres high upstands embedded 1.8 metres in the ground.

The footings weigh 13 tonnes each. The headframes of each tower weigh two tonnes and are tubular welded with a mesh floor. They are 5 metres by 1.3 metres on the lower platform and 5 metres by 1.7 metres on the top platform.

Playing Field Floodlighting: The 164 individual lamps are 1.5kw metal

halide silvania 'omega' symmetrical beam.

The lighting levels, as an average, maintain in service is: infield 770 lux (horizontal) and outfield 550 lux (horizontal).

Both infield and outfield have a switching group of half level to full level alternative which makes for maximum saving of electricity according to the type of sport being played.

There were no international standard lighting levels set down for amateur baseball and the Parry Field Committee recommended to the government that this should be the recommendations set out for triple AAA levels in American professional baseball of 700 lux infield and 500 lux outfield.

There is provision for approximately 50 additional lamps in the system if required and a further provision for an increase in light levels by around 10 per cent by professional manipulation.

However this would reduce the life of the lamps.

The electrical distribution supply originates from a site main switchboard adjacent to a 500kva SEC on-site substation.

Submains distribute to a central gear cabinet at the base of each mast with separate circuits for infield/outfield, spectator area and carpark.

A central cabinet with key switches and hour run meters is located in the pavilion building for the control and monitoring of the six lighting switching groups.

The life of the lamps is directly tied to the hours used.




