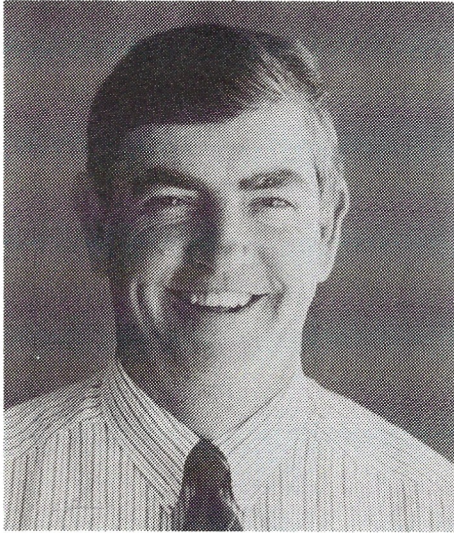

It is with great pleasure that as Patron of the 17th Asian Baseball Championship Series, I extend a warm welcome to all teams participating in this event.

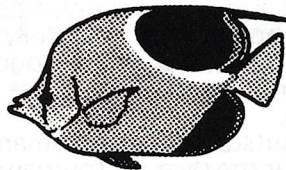

Japan are no certainties for the Asian title

Sensibilities would be offended throughout the Asian Baseball Championships if prognosticators were to dogmatically state that Japan are by far the most talented team in the tournament and that no one else need bother mustering a challenge.

Yet, that sentiment has been expressed by many analysts.

Japanese manager, Kalsizi Kawashima, who presides over an assemblage of major talents, offered only a slightly tempered prediction: "We are a young side, but we expect to win."

And another Japanese team official said: "We're just being realistic. Who has the depth of talent we have? No one."

Undeniably, the Japanese have an impressive combination of strong pitching, productive hitting and depth in nearly every position. But they had it too in 1987, before they self-destructed amid numerous injuries. A return to health, performance and some assemblance of order in the clubhouse, propelled the team to equal champions with South Korea and Chinese Taipei in Beijing two years ago.

Self-motivation is all in any sporting contest: latent talent alone is no substitute for the charged-up, inspired competitor.



Japanese Shortstop Akihiri Togo.

The combination of the two is the apex of a sportsman's ambitions a point demonstrated forcefully by Japanese shortstop Akihiri Togo at last year's Olympic Games in Barcelona.

Togo's outstanding performances throughout the Olympic tournament induced wistful expressions on the faces of many opposition batters and baserunners.

Japan won the bronze medal behind Cuba and Chinese Taipei, and at the end of the Games, Togo was

selected as the best amateur shortstop in the world.

The 25-year-old Togo had, one felt, slogged up the mountain. Now he would enjoy the views from the peak for some years.

Discipline is one of Togo's major strengths. He seizes every opportunity to pounce on the ball heading anywhere near him from the batter and sends bullet-like throws with pinpoint accuracy to the glove of the first baseman well before the batter-baserunner gets anywhere near his destination.

The Japanese coaching staff are again calling on Togo's skill in an effort to turn opposition offense into defense. Togo had also handled a bat with skill.

Nearly 11 million Japanese are registered baseball players.

There are 10,000 players in 320 industrial teams, 10,000 players in 280 college teams and 240,000 players in 4000 junior (18 and younger) teams. In addition, 240,000 players from 6000 semi-junior (under-15) teams and 320,000 players in 8000 little league teams.

The combined number of players in "rubber" baseball totals 10 million.

There are 16,000 baseball stadiums throughout Japan, with six being equipped with artificial turf.

Japan finished first in Los Angeles

in 1984 and third in Seoul in 1988, when baseball was an exhibition sport.

In one of the outstanding games between the only unbeaten teams at this tournament, Japan had a thrilling 6-5 win over South Korea.

In that game, 21-year-old left handed Futoshi Yamabe showed excellent control of the ball to pitch to 12 batters and concede only two hits. Teammate Masanori Suglura conceded one hit to seven batters.

Yuichi Yanagisawa has given command performances behind the catcher's mask and has also been a big hitter of the ball this week.

Japan, the dominant Asian team for near 40 years, will be attempting to win the title for the 12th time and South Korea, the next most successful team, hope to win for the sixth occasion.

It would be unwise to count out South Korea, who with some luck could have toppled the defending champions last Sunday night.

Pitching will be South Korea's main strength, with Chan-Ho Park, an outstanding 20-year-old who is fast approaching world-class.

He has strong support in left-handed Myung-Ju Cha, Jae-Young We and Byung-Ho Jun.

Pitching is such a focal point in the South Korean team, nine pitchers are in the squad of 20 players who travelled to Perth for this tournament.

Australian baseball has improved since this country was humiliated by the lowly Guam at the 1987 Asian Championships.

Australia failed to qualify for the 1989 titles, but made a huge impact

to be the only team to beat Japan at the 1991 titles in Beijing. Australia then lost its playoff match to Chinese Taipei over 14 innings, to finish fourth.

Chinese Taipei progressed to win the Olympic silver medal and Japan the bronze.

Australian coach Steve Gilmore realises the demands of finals require greater dedication than the qualifying games.

"The hard part approaching the finals will be keeping up the competitive edge," he said.

"It will be good mental training for us."

Australia has an array of batting talent.

South Australian Darrin Kirwin pitched eight strike-outs in six innings against the Philippines. John Deeble, Brett Cederblad, Simon Sheldon-Collins, Ross Jones, Parris Mitchell, Peter Jacobsson and Shane Tonkin can all be relied on to perform solidly from the pitching mound.

Veteran West Australian international Tony Adamson has been a tower of strength in the batter's box and lead-off batter Scott Steed has played consistently throughout the week.

The finals are expected to be the last games on home soil for Australian Olympic squad members Parris Mitchell and Richard Vagg, who have signed to play in the lucrative Japanese industrial league.

Mitchell, 31, who pitches for Perth Heat and Vagg, from the Melbourne Monarchs, have signed two-year contracts with the Kobe-based telecommunications company, Abekigyo.

They will join Adelaide Giants' Andrew Scott and Gold Coast Dolphins' Brett Cederblad.

Australia showed that they could make an impact on the final round series and become serious gold medal contenders when they were just pipped by Japan in last Tuesday night's Round Five fixture of the championships.

With the top four likely to be Japan, South Korea, Chinese Taipei and Australia, the home team's coach Steve Gilmore will be looking for his charges to continue their best form out of their clash with the Japanese who are the yardstick.

Japan, the 1992 Olympic silver medallists and now ranked No. 2 in the world behind Cuba, is the guide used by many other teams in the world to judge their performances. So Australia's 6-7 loss was a top class effort.

"In 1964 they won the Olympic Tournament and were Bronze medallists in Barcelona and we have shown we can hold our own against them," Australian coach Steve Gilmore said.

"Australia measures up to all the teams in this championship and we can get to the gold medal round now."

Australia's performance this week has earned it a place at next year's World Championships in Nicaragua and an opportunity to win a medal for the first time in the Asian zone.

Japan, who remain unbeaten up to and including day six of the tournament have had the perfect draw in the championship and will be looking to maintain their unbeaten run right through the finals.

History of World Tournaments

Between 1938 and 1972, 20 world championships were held through the world. Beginning in 1973, a plan was devised to hold the World Championship Baseball Series during even-numbered years and the Intercontinental Cup during odd-numbered years. Participants in the senior-level World Championship now are determined through continental qualification events in the years immediately preceding the World Championship.

At the 1990 IBA Congress in Edmonton, Canada, it was decided that the World Championships would be held every four years beginning in 1994.

The Intercontinental Cup is an invitational tournament in which the participating teams are selected by the host country, but must include the defending Intercontinental Cup champion.

Baseball was an official Olympic medal sport for the first time in 1992 at Barcelona, Spain. Baseball has been a demonstration sport in the Olympics several times in the 20th century, including 1984 in Los Angeles and 1988 in Seoul.

Spain, as the host country, participated in the 1992 Olympic baseball competition. The top four finishers in the 1991 Pan American Games qualified, as did the top two teams in the 1991 Asia Baseball Federation Championships in Beijing, and the winner of the 1991 European Senior Championships in Rome.

The AA World Youth competition for 13-15 year olds began officially in 1989 at Tokyo, Japan. The AAA competition for 16-18 year olds began in 1981. The IBA President's Cup, which began in 1988, is designed to help developing baseball countries compete against established baseball nations. It is a senior level (18 and above) tournament, but the players are not necessarily of national-team calibre. The IBA recognizes an A level for the under-13 age group, and has initiated development programs for this group.

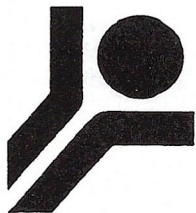

30 BASEBALL TERMS TO KNOW AND USE



1. **Around the horn:** Slang meaning a double play or simply throwing the ball around the infield.
2. **Balk (call of umpire):** Penalty for an illegal movement by the pitcher. Rule is designed to prevent pitchers from deliberately deceiving the runners. If called, baserunners advance one base.
3. **Bases loaded:** Runners at each base.
4. **Bullpen:** Area designated for pitchers to warm-up. Generally consists of two mounds and two home plates.
5. **Bunt:** Short hit that is executed by letting the ball hit the bat (not swinging) used to surprise the fielders or to advance a runner.
6. **Change up:** A slow-pitch thrown with the exact same arm action as a fastball, designed to disrupt the timing of the hitters.
7. **Choke-up:** Gripping the bat up on the handle away from the knob of the bat.
8. **Clean-up hitter:** Player who hits fourth in the batting order.
9. **Closer:** Relief pitcher who specialises in pitching the last few outs of a game.
10. **Count:** The number of called balls and strikes on a hitter.
11. **Curve:** Pitch that moves down, across, or down and across, depending upon the rotation of the ball.
12. **Designated hitter:** Player who bat's in the pitchers spot in the lineup. The DH does not have a fielding position.
13. **Dugout:** Enclosed seating facility reserved for players, substitutes, coaches and other uniformed team members.
14. **Fast ball:** A straight pitch thrown by the pitcher as hard as possible.
15. **Forkball:** A pitch thrown by placing the ball between the first two fingers, usually resulting in a sinking ball.
16. **Fungo bat:** A light and usually long bat used to hit balls during infield and outfield practice.
17. **Hit and run:** Play-action situation in which the batter must swing at the pitch while the base runner attempts to steal the base.
18. **Intentional walk:** Four balls thrown on purpose to a batter advancing the hitter to first base. Generally executed when first base is empty to set up a force play.
19. **Knuckle ball:** A pitch thrown by gripping one of the seams on the ball with fingernails and/or knuckles of the forefinger and middle finger with the thumb and other fingers underneath the ball. The ball is pushed out of the hand by the two fingers to keep the ball from rotating, causing the ball to move in an unpredictable manner.
20. **On deck:** A term used to refer to the next batter up in the inning. This person stands in a designated circular area and warms up before batting.
21. **Passed ball:** A pitched ball missed by the catcher, allowing a runner to advance.
22. **Pepper game:** A rapid, soft-toss game between a batter and fielders or between two players during practice.
23. **Pull hitter:** A batter that generally hits to the same side of the field that he bats (eg, righthanded pull hitter hits to the left side of the field).
24. **Relief pitcher:** The pitcher replacing the starting pitcher. The relief pitcher can win, lose, save or not be involved in the game's final score.
25. **Run batted in (RBI):** Statistic which shows how often a players has made it possible for his teammates to score while at bat. A player who has 30 RBIs has caused 30 runs to score. A batter is not credited with an RBI if he hits into a double play or if the run scored because of an error.
26. **Sinker:** A fast pitch that breaks downward as it reaches the plate.
27. **Slider:** A pitch that appears to the batter as a fastball until it reaches the plate, then breaks sharply on a level plane. The ball is held similarly to the curveball, but the wrist is kept straight, like a fastball, and broken downward.
28. **Spit ball:** Illegal pitch in which a foreign substance (most commonly spit or grease) is applied to the ball causing it to react in an unpredictable manner.
29. **Strike zone:** The area over home plate between the batter's armpits and knees when the batter is positioned to swing. Any pitch that is delivered through this area is called a strike.
30. **Suicide squeeze play:** A play in which a runner on third breaks toward home on the pitch and the batter's responsibility is to bunt the ball allowing the runner to score.

The Game Of Baseball

Length of Game

A time limit may be established before beginning the game or the standard device of agreeing on a certain amount of offense-defense changes can be employed (usually being nine innings).

Game Objective

To score more runs than the other team.

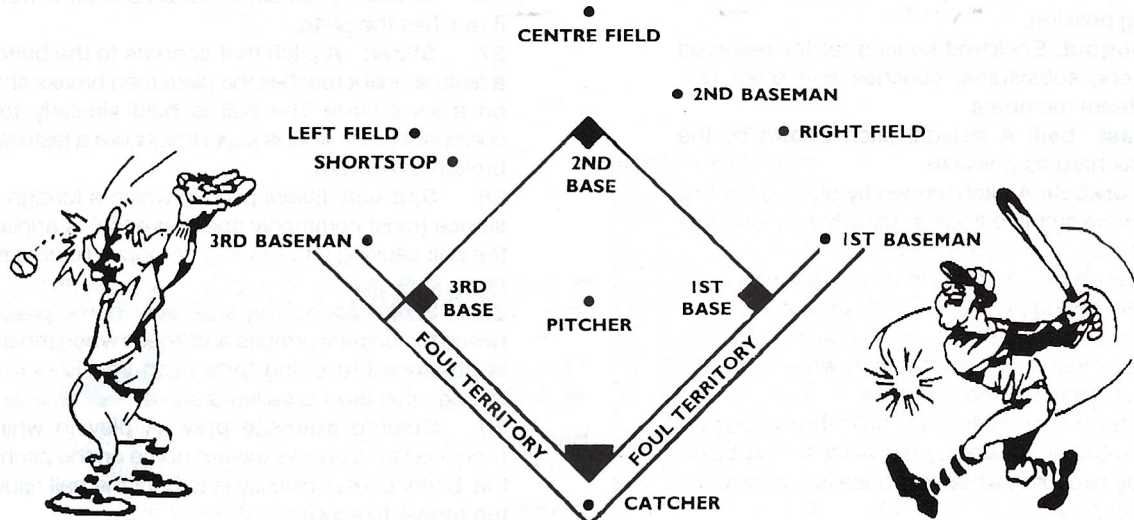
Glossary

- Ball:** A ball which does not enter the Strike Zone.
- Base:** An object placed at each right angle of a baseball diamond.
- Base on Balls:** Four balls occur on a batter before he has three strikes or hits a fair ball.
- Baserunner:** Offensive player who advances the bases.
- Batter:** Offensive player who attempts to hit the ball from home plate.
- Catch:** Thrown or batted ball held by defender.
- Dead Ball:** Ball not playable. There are four situations which cause a dead ball:
 - Umpires may rule ball dead;
 - Foul ball roller;
 - Foul fly which leaves entire playing area;

(d) Logical situation which stops play, ie. batter hit by pitch.

- Defense:** At least nine defenders who take positions within the baseball field.
- Error:** A misplayed, thrown or batted ball by defense.
- Fair Ball:** Batted roller which stays within the grand angle when it passes 1st or 3rd base. Batted fly which lands inside playing area.
- Fair Territory:** That area between the extension of the initial angle which is bounded on the sides by lines (foul lines).
- Fielder:** Any defensive player. Each has a specific name according to the position in the field.
- Fly Ball:** Batted ball which goes up in the air.
- Force:** Offensive runner must advance to next base because batter/runner/runners from preceding base/bases oblige him.
- Foul Ball:** Batted roller which passes 1st or 3rd base outside of initial angle. Also, any batted ball touched by defensive player when it is outside of the extension of the initial angle.
- Home Run:** Batter runs entire diamond and returns to home base in one play, scoring a run for team.
- Completed Innings:** Six outs in which teams alternate on offense and defense.
- Live Ball:** The ball is playable in the usual state of the baseball.

- Out:** Elimination of an offensive player.
- Pitch Ball:** Thrown by the pitcher to the batter — usual way to initiate play in baseball.
- Roller:** Batted ball which rolls or bounces on the ground.
- Run:** The advance of an offensive player from home base to 1st, 2nd or 3rd and home base again. Each is a run for the offensive.
- Safe:** Offensive player advances without being eliminated and may remain on the base to which he advances.
- Strike:** Pitched ball which:
 - Enters the strike zone;
 - The batter attempts to hit;
 - Results in a foul ball.
- Strike Out:** Batter misses completely the third strike and is eliminated. Umpires may rule strike out if pitch enters the strike zone, even though the batter does not attempt to hit it.
- Strike Zone:** Rectangular area formed by the width of the home base, the armpits and the top of the knees of the batter.
- Tag Out:** Defender touches offensive player between bases with the ball and eliminates him.
- Tag Up:** Baserunner remains on base until defender touches fly ball and then attempts to advance.
- Time Out:** Umpire declares that play is suspended, ball is dead.
- Umpire:** Game regulator.
