FOREWORD.

THE FESTIVITIES which are to take place at Katanning between April 29th and May 4th, 1939, of which this Souvenir Programme provides a brief but comprehensive outline, are to celebrate the completion of 50 years of progress and achievement. Prior to 1889, except for the scattered farming properties of the earliest settlers (some of whom and many of whose sons and daughters are still actively engaged in farming and other pursuits in the district) the hand of civilised man had scarcely touched the area where there now exists the town of Katanning and the well-cultivated and productive land which surrounds or is adjacent to it. In 1889 the West Australian Land Company completed, at a spot a few miles north of the present town, the building of the Great Southern Railway, which had been commenced simultaneously from the north at Beverley and from the south at Albany. With the railway came those who founded the town's commerce and industry, the best remembered of whom is the late Hon. F. H. Piesse, C.M.G., who became the district's representative in Parliament. In the years that have elapsed there has arisen the town of Katanning with its well-kept thoroughfares (a credit to the local government of the Katanning Road Board), its substantial buildings, its sporting and educational facilities, and its many happy homes. Around it welldeveloped farms are to be seen on every hand, producing much of the real wealth without which this State could not have progressed. Upon the solid foundation laid by the pioneers, a fine structure has been erected. Is it any wonder, then, that the citizens of to-day desire to commemorate the work and perpetuate the memory of these foundation builders? In doing so, they ask YOU to join in their festivities.

Promptly at 10 a.m., at Police Pools Reserve, two miles S.E. of Katanning, unveiling of Memorial erected by the Katanning Branch of the Western Australian Historical Society to perpetuate the memories of Sergeant McKenna, Trooper (afterwards Sergeant) Grover, and Trooper Fahey, the first Police Officers stationed in the Katanning district. This memorial has been erected as nearly as possible on the site of the first Police camp. The present office-bearers of the Katanning Branch of the W.A. Historical Society are as follows:—President, Hon. A. Thomson, M.L.C.; Vice-Presidents, Messrs. J. F. Hillman, J.P., and S. H. Dale; Hon. Secretary, Mr. H. W. Baker; Hon. Treasurer, Mr. I. Synnott, J.P. It is anticipated that this memorial will be unveiled in the presence of His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of Western Australia, Sir James Mitchell, K.C.M.G., the Commissioner of Police, and executive members of the W.A. Historical Society. The Katanning Brass Band will be in attendance. All present will be requested to join in the singing of the hymn "O God, Our Help in Ages Past"—

POLICE MEMORIAL



To be unveiled at Police Pools Reserve on Monday, May 1, 1939, at 10 a.m., by Mrs. Alice M. Keeley, a daughter of Sergeant Grover and whose birthplace was on the reserve. A thousand ages in Thy sight
Are like an evening gone,
Short as the watch that ends night
Before the rising sun.

Time, like an ever-rolling stream,
Bears all its sons away;
They fly forgotten as a dream
Dies at the opening day.

O God, our help in ages past,
Our hope for years to come,

The President (Hon. A. Thomson, M.L.C.) will be the first speaker. The Lieutenant-Governor (Sir James Mitchell), as State President of the W.A. Historical Society (if present), will then be requested to invite Mrs. Alice M. Keeley (a daughter of Sergeant Grover and whose birthplace was on the Reserve) to actually unveil the memorial. If His Excellency is unable to attend, this duty will be undertaken by a member of the W.A. Historical Society. Mrs. Keeley having unveiled the memorial, a member of the Katanning Band will sound the "Last Post." A vote of thanks will then be moved by the Commissioner of Police and seconded by Hon. C. H. Wittenoom, M.L.C.

10.45 a.m.: LEAVE POLICE POOLS RESERVE. Proceed to Climic Crossing over Great Southern Railway about four miles north of Katanning. ROUTE: Via Clive St. West to Main Perth Road, along this road to its junction with Trimmer Road, and along Trimmer and Climic roads to the crossing.

11.0 a.m.: Unveiling of Great Southern Railway Memorial.

At this site a memorial provided by the Comissioner of Railways in commemoration of the completion near this spot in 1889 of the Great Southern Railway will be unveiled by Mr. J. W. R. Broadfoot, Chief Mechanical Engineer, W.A. Government Railways. The President (Hon. A. Thomson, M.L.C.) will request Mr. S. Hedges Dale, Vice-President of the Katanning Branch W.A. Historical Society, to explain the reasons for the desire of the Branch for the erection of the memorial and to call upon Mr. Broadfoot to unveil it. Mr. Broadfoot will then unveil the memorial and address the gathering. A vote of thanks to the Commissioner for donating the memorial, and to Mr. Broadfoot, will be moved by Mr. A. F. Watts, M.L.A., and seconded by Hon. H. V. Piesse, M.L.C.
