# WELCOME TO PERTH HEAT AT THE WACA



The Perth HEAT welcomes you to the WACA, WA's home of baseball. The WACA was the original playing ground for baseball when the West Australian Baseball League was formed in 1935. The Perth HEAT's return in 1996 brought baseball back to its home base..

Not only has baseball grown since those early days - so has the WACA. It is now a world class sporting facility - home to baseball, cricket, football and rugby.

## THE GAME OF BASEBALL

The Perth HEAT will have seven home series at the WACA during the FAI Cup 1997/98 baseball season. Each home series will consist of either a Double Header on two consecutive nights or three Single games over three nights.

A Double Header is two seven innings games with a 30 minute break at half time. A Single Game has nine innings with a short break known as the Seventh Inning Stretch.

## OFF-FIELD COMPETITIONS

Baseball is an exciting game - and there's usually just as much fun and activity happening off the ground as there is on field.

- The Heatwave and Hot Dog**  
 The Coolbreeze Heatwave are the HEAT's devastating dance girls. They help run our competitions, hand out prizes, lead the Mexican Wave and cheer on the HEAT. Their friend-on-the-field is our cool mascot Watsonia Hot Dog.
- Lucky Programme Numbers**  
 Check your lucky programme number on the front cover. If your number is called out during the game you could win a prize or be part of a competition on the field.
- Dance Competitions**  
 We want you to get up and dance with us. So at certain breaks, when the Heatwave ask you to get up and dance - DANCE. The best dancers win some great prizes. (The players love to see their fans up dancing in the stadium.)
- KFC Foul Ball**  
 Whenever a foul ball is hit out over the nets and into the crowd - catch that ball! It will be yours to keep courtesy of KFC. That's a real 'fowl' ball.
- Strike Out!**  
 When a member of the opposing team strikes out, the Heatwave will throw a Strike Out Smoking Ball to one of the fans. The ball is thrown to you care of Healthways and Strike Out Smoking.
- Pop-Up Competition**  
 Our Pop-Up sellers will be selling tickets before and through the early part of the game. It only costs \$1 for a Pop-Up ticket. At half time and Seventh Inning Stretch breaks, two lucky fans, an adult and a child, will be drawn to be part of the Pop-Up Competition. The ball is shot up from the Pop-Up machine and you have to try and catch it. One or two catches wins a minor prize and three catches wins a great prize from our sponsors.
- 50/50**  
 Come to the baseball and win money too! Enter the 50/50 Competition by buying a ticket for \$2 from one of our ticket sellers. The money goes into a pool and towards the end of the game, one lucky ticket buyer scoops the pool and takes home the money.

Fans will be invited to participate in on-field competitions. All people chosen are to meet at the Merchandise Stall which is located inside the main Barry Shepherd Gate. All prizes can also be collected from there.

- Major Competitions**  
 There are a number of major competitions run throughout the season. Many of the people competing in the competitions will be chosen from the ticket entry forms. Just fill in the details on your ticket, or ask the ticket sellers for a form and place it in the box provided. Then you could be part of some of the great competitions with some major prizes to be won.
- Series**  
 Every Perth HEAT home series will be brought to you by one of our sponsors with different competitions and prizes to be won.
- Autographs**  
 At the end of each night, our fans can go on to the field and get autographs from your favourite players. Access to the field is through the small gate on the perimeter near First Base. You must not enter the arena until you are given permission.
- Merchandise**  
 There is some great Perth HEAT merchandise: Caps, T-Shirts, Players replica tops, Jackets, HEAT baseballs and inflatable baseball bats. These are all available from the Merchandise Stall which is located inside the main Barry Shepherd Gate.
- Catering**  
 Food and drinks are available at a number of outlets in the stadium. Underneath the Western QBE Stand, inside the Barry Shepherd entrance and between the Prindiville and Farley Stands.
- Facilities**  
 Toilets are located at the back of the Western QBE Stand, through the bar underneath the Western QBE Stand and in the Farley Stand.
- Parking**  
 Parking is available across the road from the WACA in the Nelson Crescent Parking areas and on the streets near the WACA.

*The WACA is a smoke free venue during Perth HEAT games.*

## HOW TO READ THE SCOREBOARD

The visiting team is always listed first on the scoreboard because they always bat first. Under each inning number the number of runs a team scores is listed. In this example the visitors scored no runs in the first inning and the HEAT scored one.

The right hand side of the board shows R, H and E which stands for runs, hits and errors. The H stands for the number of safe hits each team has managed against the opposing pitchers. The R stands for the number of hits that were converted to runs and the E stands for the number of errors made in the defence of those runs.

On the left hand side of the board before the team names is a series of lights. The first column indicates how many balls the batter hitting has against him. The second column indicates how many strikes there are against his name and the third column shows how many hitters are out in this inning.

The Perth HEAT hope that you enjoy the 1997/98 FAI Cup Baseball. Join in the CHARGE, scream for your team and have a great night out at the baseball as the Perth HEAT Light Up The WACA.

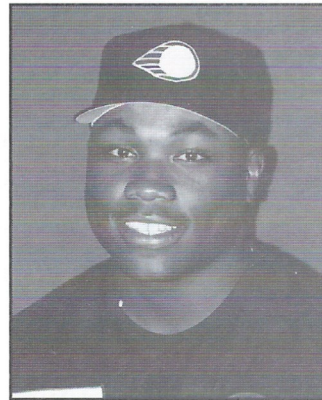

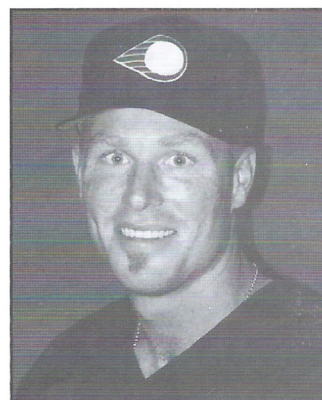

## Hunter Eagles

LAST YEAR: 7th PREDICTION: 8th 18-38



Early hopes that this could have been the best ever eighth best team in the history of the ABL have not been reflected by Hunter's poor results. The Eagles have improved steadily and this was demonstrated by their ability last season to win games against most teams. Unfortunately the Eagles lack the player depth of many ABL teams and their inability to entice players from other ABL teams has been a problem. Even though the city of Newcastle has been in hype-overdrive after the Knights stirring deeds in the ARL last year, the magic hasn't seemed to rub off on the Eagles. A new affiliation with the New York Mets will no doubt help the Eagles develop for the future.

**Player Watch:** Leighton Wingrove – pitcher who stepped up last season and will be looking to repeat his performance as this season closes; Chris Bradley – his hitting has been among the league's very best all year.

## Perth HEAT

LAST YEAR: Champions PREDICTION: 3rd 33-23



It looked for a while as if the HEAT would miss this year's play-offs. However, after dropping all the way down to sixth after a string of heavy defeats, Perth look like they are finally turning things around. A series win against Gold Coast last week was a vital confidence booster for the defending champions. As ever, ace hitter Greg Jelks continues to be the key for the Heat. His form in the second half of the season has been phenomenal. Hitters Sean Jones, Jason Hewitt and Leigh Moyle are all in top shape. On the mound, all eyes have been on Simon Eissens, whose brilliant recent performances have helped keep the HEAT in the title race. The HEAT must win this vitally important series if they are to be serious contenders for this year's championship.

## IT'S EASY TO KEEP SCORE

The scorecard allows the fan and the enthusiast to keep an accurate record of the events of the game. All players are numbered and all plays are recorded as symbols. The code numbers for the players are:

Pitcher	1	Third Baseman	5	Right Fielder	9

The code numbers for the different fielders allow you to record the outs and refer back to see who made the play. A ball caught in the air would be shown by an (F) then followed by the number of the player who made the catch. Where there is a throw involved in the out, both players' numbers are reflected. Thus, a groundball to shortstop with the batter shown out at first base would be noted as '6-3', or a fly ball caught by the left fielder would be noted as 'F7'.

There are a number of symbols which reflect the various plays which can occur during a game. The symbols are entered in the scoring blocks contained in the scorecard as follows: the lower left-hand corner of the block is considered as home. Progress by the player around the bases is shown by moving counter-clockwise around the block with the lower right corner being first base, the upper right corner being second base and so forth. The common symbols are:

**1st Inning** - fly ball caught by the centre fielder (8) for the first out of the inning.

**3rd Inning** - Single, stole second base, and scored on a base hit by the 4th batter in the line-up.

**6th Inning** - Ground ball to the shortstop for the third out of the inning.

**8th Inning** - Double, stole third base, and scored on a sacrifice fly to the right fielder.

The main thing to remember about scoring is that it is supposed to enhance your enjoyment of the game. Don't worry if you are doing it 'right'. Everyone has their own little idiosyncrasies when it comes to keeping score. If you can look down at your scorecard and know what happened three innings earlier you have been successful.

## WORKING OUT THE STATISTICS

**Batting Average (AVG):** Divide the total number of hits by the total times at bat.

**At Bats (AB):** Number of times a player batted, except that no time at bat shall be charged when the batter hits a sacrifice bunt or sacrifice fly, is awarded a walk, is hit by a pitch, or is awarded first base because of interference or obstruction.

**Run (R):** Every time a base runner safely crosses home plate a run is scored.

**Hit (H):** A play in which the batter safely reaches a base after hitting the ball, without aid from a fielding error or fielders choice.

**Home Run (HR):** A ball hit out of the playing field in fair territory.

**Runs Batted In (RBI):** Shows how often a player has made it possible for his teammates to score while at bat. A player who has 10 RBIs for example has caused 10 runs to be scored. A batter is not credited with an RBI if he hits into a double play or if the run is scored because of an error.

**Base on Balls (BB):** A walk. Indicates the number of times a batter makes it to first base as a result of a pitcher throwing four balls. This does not count as an 'at bat'.

**Earned Run Average (ERA):** Multiply the total earned runs charged against a pitchers pitching by nine, and divide the result by the total number of innings the pitcher pitches.

**Win-Loss (W-L):** A pitcher is declared the winning pitcher

**Save (S):** A pitcher is credited with a save when he meets all three of the following conditions:

- He is the finishing pitcher in a game won by his club.
- He is not the winning pitcher; and
- He qualifies under one of the following conditions:
  - i) He enters the game with a lead of no more than three runs and pitches for at least one inning, or
  - ii) He enters the game, regardless of the count, with the potential tying run either already on base or one of the first two batters he faces.
  - iii) He pitches effectively for at least three innings. No more than one save may be credited in each game.

**Inning Pitched (IP):** The number of innings a pitcher throws. If the pitcher is replaced with only one out or with only two outs, the incomplete inning is represented by a decimal point of .1 or .2. For example a pitcher replaced after two outs in the second inning will have thrown 5.2 innings.

**Hits (H):** Number of times a batter reaches a base when the pitcher has thrown the ball without the aid of a fielding error or fielder's choice.

**Runs (R):** Number of runs scored while the pitcher is on the mound.

**Earned Run (ER):** A run scored on a hit, walk or steal without benefit from a defensive error on the play.

If a pitcher enters a game with a runner on a base and that runner subsequently scores an earned run goes against the pitcher who left the game and not the new pitcher.

**Base on Balls (BB):** Number of times a batter reaches first base as the result of the pitcher throwing four balls, either intentionally or unintentionally.

**Strikeouts (SO):** Number of outs recorded by recording three strikes on a batter.
