Sunday September 16 saw the culmination of the Club's Junior Championships, brought forward during 2001 to avoid a clash with many other junior tournaments being held in WA...

Forty juniors took part and again this year some excellent scores were registered over the 54 hole event. Top honours in both the Junior Girls and Boys' divisions were actually a repeat of the Junior Championships in 2000.

STEVE DARTNELL with rounds of 80-78-77 for a 3 round total of 235 took out the Boys' Junior Champion title for the second year in a row, with MARK WESTERN 5 shots further astern on 240.

BREE TURNBULL was the Girls' Division Champion with a consistent 80-80-79 for 239 defeating EMMA STEWART.

In the Nett Division the overall Girls winner was KIRSTY NORQUAY (17) who recorded 232 whilst NICHOLAS

LEEDER (25), produced excellent golf over each day of the event finishing a clear winner in the Boys Division on 204.

2001 MGGC Junior Club Champion Bree Turnbull took out the final 36 hole match play decider with a win over co-state player Rochelle Miles.

Regrettably, with four of the eight junior finalists, the Melville Glades quartet actually had to play each other in the quarter-finals with Emma qualifying No 1 after rounds of 75/71. She defeated Kirsty, who as a sub-junior, actually qualified in the Top 8 of the Junior Division with two rounds of 84.

Bree defeated Tifanie in their quarterfinal clash, with Rochelle taking out the semi-final from Emma at the 19th.

Bree defeated Danielle Hendrie to move through to set up the Final showdown with Cottesloe's Rochelle Miles.

In addition to the WGWA Champions' Trophy won by Bree, Emma won the Consistency Award & 36 holes Gross, whilst Kirsty collected the Best 36 Holes Nett (134).
